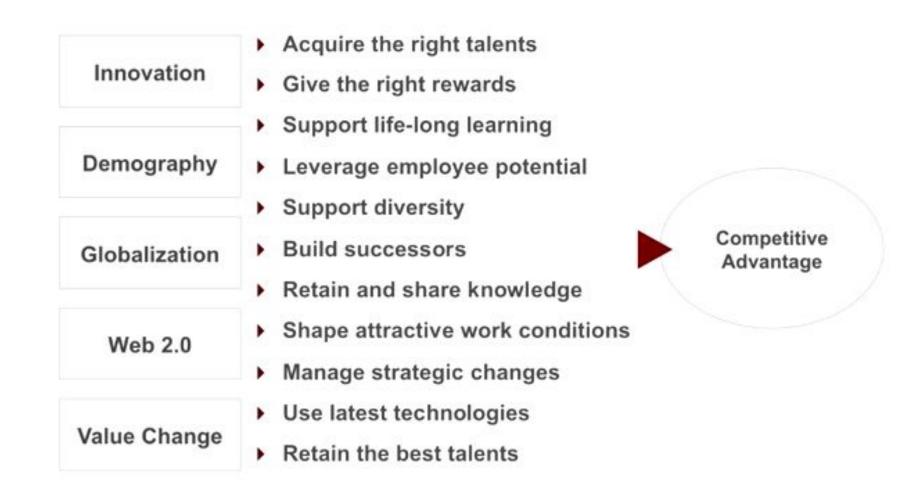

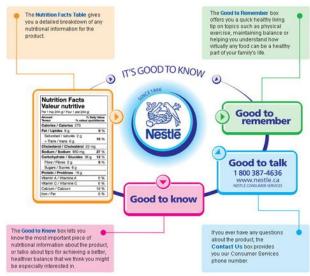

Definitions

Brain drain - The loss of high-talent key personnel to competitors or start-up ventures. **Decentralization** - Transferring responsibility and decision-making authority from a central office to people and locations closer to the situation that demands attention.

Egalitarianism - the doctrine that all people are equal and deserve equal rights and opportunities.
